The February 9 announcement that, effective immediately, our co-pastors will be on a two-month leave of absence came as a shock to many of us. At the Prayer & Sharing Time in the Social Room following the service, we were given the opportunity to openly express our feelings and concerns. As Christians in community, we have the Holy Spirit to comfort and guide us. We know that, although there is a breach in the co-pastors' relationship, nevertheless, we still love them both and know they both still love us. We as a congregation have done nothing to cause this breach.

With God's help, your Session is striving to continue the ministries of our church. As Rev. Amy Fowler advised us in her sermon entitled *Love* on February 16, we need to pray every day for everyone involved, to refrain from gossip, and in the spirit of presumed innocence, to avoid taking sides. We need to be patient to allow the process of the leave of absence to work with the assistance of the Care Team of the Committee on Ministry of the Presbytery of the Genesee Valley. And, finally, "Choose to care for your church more than you care for yourself. The future of your church is in God's hands, and your behavior will play a major role going forward from here. This is love in action."

Our church has faced challenges in the past and has emerged stronger. That is our goal now. Session will keep you informed when there is more to share. Meanwhile, Georgia Hubbard (265-1224), Elaine Wilbert (503-9141) and Barbara Hach (746-0764) are available for needs at times when the office is not open.

STEWARDSHIP

Stewardship is year around – not just when we bring our tithes and offerings on Sunday morning.

We are all given a measure of spiritual gifts – not for ourselves, but for us to use in God's service.

"For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, **and each member belongs to all the others.** We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully." (Romans 12:4-8)



The body of Christ is not built up unless we freely share our talents and skills with each other.

"Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins. Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling. Each of you should **use whatever gift you have received to serve others**, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms." (1 Peter 4:8-10)

Living the Love of Christ is an active form of stewardship – offering hospitality and sharing our gifts with others. Spend some time thinking about what you enjoy and what you are good at. Then think about some ways that you can use your skills and experiences to help others and to build up our church family. And finally, decide to do something about it – that is Living the Love of Christ, otherwise known as "being a faithful steward of God's grace."
